ADIDAS STEALS FROM WORKERS



In 2020, the workers at the Hulu Garment Factory in Cambodia who made clothes for adidas were tricked into signing a resignation letter concealed under a payslip they needed to sign to receive their wages.

Four years on, these workers have still not received the **\$1 million** in payments they would have been owed if they had been officially fired, while adidas refuses to take responsibility.

This is not a freak incident. Brands are quick to shift orders to other factories, especially during times of crisis, leaving workers around the globe without pay.

Unionists and activists have developed a solution to this problem: a guarantee fund paid for by brands to ensure workers are never again left penniless when the unexpected happens. And yet adidas still refuses to sign, denying thousands of workers in its supply chain the financial security they so direly need.
